
ELIJAH THE PROPHET



Have you heard of Elijah? He was a mighty prophet when King Ahab and his son Ahaziah ruled over Israel, the northern kingdom. Both kings were idol worshippers. So God sent Elijah to rebuke them for Israel's idolatry.

Elijah did not have the fear of man, not even of kings. God answered all his prayers and gave him power to perform miracles. Yet, there were times when he felt alone, weak and afraid. When Jezebel, Ahab's wife, wanted to kill him, he ran like crazy for his life. In fact, he ran a very long distance from Jezreel

in the north, to Beersheba in the south. Well, the Bible says that he was "a man subject to like passions as we are". It means that he was like any of us. He also had feelings of discouragement and fear at times. Though Elijah trusted God, there were times when he felt that God was not with him.

No matter how Elijah felt, God never left Elijah. He raised Elijah up again from his despair, supplied all his needs of food during the drought, gave him rest and assured him of His presence. We have a wonderful God. So, whenever we feel afraid and God seems so far away, let us overcome this feeling with earnest prayers.

IDOLATRY IN THE NORTHERN KINGDOM OF ISRAEL

All the kings of the northern kingdom of Israel were wicked and did evil in the sight of the Lord. But Ahab did the most evil among them. He actively promoted all forms of idolatry in Israel.

Ahab married Jezebel, the daughter of the pagan king of the Zidonians, named Eth-baal. Ahab followed her in the worship of Baal and all the idols that she had placed rampantly throughout Israel, especially in Samaria, the capital city. Jezebel ambitiously promoted the worship of her idols and idolatry spread throughout the land. Ahab sinned against God. He broke both the First and Second Commandments. He worshipped false gods instead of the true and living God and made all sorts of graven images. These sins of Israel angered God. He sent Prophet Elijah to prophesy a drought over the nation.

What is an idol? It is a statue or object that people bow down to worship or pray to. It also refers to anything or anyone in your life that you love more than God. It could be your computer games, your studies, a friend or a favourite singer or movie star. It is wonderful to memorise the Ten Commandments because it will help us not to sin against God. Do you know them?

It is very clear from Exodus 20:4 that we should not worship idols. Write this verse down and try to keep it in your heart:

Thought: God hates idolatry the most.

Prayer: Our Heavenly Father, help us to worship only Thee all our lives. In Jesus' name I pray. Amen.

ELIJAH'S FIRST PROPHECY BEFORE KING AHAB

Israel, under the rule of King Ahab, had turned her back on God and gone to worship other gods. The Jews were steeped in idolatry. In mercy, God raised prophets to warn His people to repent of their sins and to foretell His punishment if they continue to sin. God sent Elijah to tell Ahab that God will shortly send a drought to punish the nation.

We learnt from Jesus in Luke 4:25 that the drought lasted for 3 years and 6 months. Imagine that – such a long drought! There would be so much suffering among the people. During a drought, when cattle and plants perish, there would be shortage of food and water. Put yourself in Elijah's shoes. He had to appear before an evil king to deliver such a piece of bad news. Won't you be trembling with fear? One word from Ahab could send Elijah's head rolling.

Elijah was truly brave. He believed that God will be with him always and confident that God will protect him. We too can have this confidence. What can we learn from Elijah? We can be sure that as long as we are doing what God wants us to do, man cannot harm us.

In Matthew 21:12 we read of a courageous deed of Jesus.

Thought: We must fear God rather than man.

GOD'S PROMISE OF RAIN AND WARNING AGAINST IDOLATRY

When God sent Elijah to prophesy a drought, there seemed to be no prior warning. It seemed like God did not give them a chance to repent. Let us look into history to help us find out the truth.

In Deuteronomy, we find that God had spoken to the people of Israel through Moses, long before they entered the Promised Land. They were told to diligently keep God's commandments and to love the Lord their God and to serve Him with all their heart and soul. When they serve God whole-heartedly, God will bless them with rain in due season and they will have plentiful harvests. Their cattle will thrive as they can feed on the grass which will be green and abundant. But, He also warned them against worshipping other gods and idols. This is a very important "but". If they do not serve the Lord God whole-heartedly, He will be angry. God is a jealous God who wants them to be faithful. If they become unfaithful, God will shut the windows of heaven and there will be no rain. Both crops and people will perish. In other words, there will be droughts and famines.

God instructed them to keep His Word in their hearts and in their souls. They must teach their children and all future generations to remember it forever. Alas! The kings and people of Israel (the northern kingdom) became more and more disobedient and idolatrous over time. King Ahab was especially evil under the influence of Jezebel, his wife

WHAT MADE ELIJAH SO COURAGEOUS?

It took much courage for Elijah to confront the evil king, Ahab with God's harsh words. His life was at stake because the king had the power to kill him. Ever wondered why he was so bold?

The Bible tells us that Elijah prayed earnestly and God answered all his prayers. For God to answer his prayers, he must have prayed according to God's will. What does that mean? That means he knew what God wanted him to do. So, we can say that he lived a godly life. He knew and kept God's word in his heart and kept listening for God's orders. He was ever ready to carry out God's orders. Elijah knew that the God he was worshipping is the same powerful God who parted the Red Sea for the children of Israel and drowned the pursuing Egyptians. He is the same God who fed the two million in the wilderness with manna for forty years. He believed that the same almighty God will protect him.

Elijah believed that God's words will come true. Therefore, he was not afraid to say the harsh words to even the king! Do you believe God's Word will come true? If so, children, would you not want to share with others? May you be bold to speak the truth about God and our Saviour Jesus Christ.

GOD PROTECTS AND PROVIDES FOR ELIJAH.

After Elijah had spoken to Ahab, God told him to turn eastward and hide himself by the brook Cherith which was just before Jordan. Elijah obeyed God and went as directed.

By the brook of Cherith, something unusual happened. You must have fed a bird or birds before. But have you ever experienced a bird bringing you food? Elijah did! Ravens brought him bread and meat in the morning and evening. Ravens are large glossy black species of crows. They are known to be greedy. You would expect these birds to eat up the food before Elijah could even notice! It is indeed a miracle that they delivered food to Elijah. Only God, the Creator of heaven and earth, has the power to make ravens do that. The brook which is a little stream, supplied drinking water for Elijah.

God knows our every need and lovingly provides for us. See how He provided Elijah with a safe place to rest, his meals and water. He even knows our future needs. As we read more about Elijah's experience, we will find God never fails to protect and provide for His children.

GOD WILL ALWAYS PROVIDE FOR THE GODLY

While Elijah was in hiding by the brook of Cherith, many people in Israel were starving. Their suffering was caused by their sin of idolatry. But there were some godly prophets who were hidden and fed with food and water. God never fails to provide for the righteous!

Just as God provided for Elijah, God will always provide for those who trust in Him. Philippians 4:19 tells us that God will supply all our needs. There are many overseas students studying in Far Eastern Bible College, Singapore who can testify how God provided for them and their families at home. Many come from poor countries. When God called them into full-time Christian service, they had to give up their jobs, leave their homes and come to be trained in Singapore. Every one of them shared how God met their needs and provided lovingly. God sent generous people into their lives to give and support them financially and in many ways. They know that God is faithful and will always supply all their needs as long as they obey God.

Children, your parents may lose their jobs at times. Don't be anxious. Pray and wait for God's provision. There was a man named George Muller. He built an orphanage for 5,000 orphans and never had to approach anyone for donations. That was because George Muller approached the richest person in the whole universe. Who is He? God. George Muller simply prayed and waited on God, and all his needs, and those of the 5,000 orphans were met without fail!

ELIJAH AT ZAREPHATH

As the drought lasted for 3 years and 6 months, the water in the brook Cherith also gradually dried up. Perhaps we will not be able to fully understand that for we have never experienced a drought. A drought often results in famine and death. However, without a doubt, God continued to care for Elijah. This time, God directed him to Zarephath at Zidon. This town is on the coast and all the way to the west of Israel. It is also the place where Jezebel, king Ahab's wife came from.

Imagine that! Needless to say, Zarephath was a pagan place full of idols. Yet God sent Elijah there. If that was not surprising enough, God said that He had commanded a widow to provide food and lodging for him. Widows were the poorest people because they have no husbands to provide for them. Guess what? The Bible said, "So, he arose and went to Zarephath." Elijah did not hesitate. As soon as he heard God, he obeyed. He never questioned God. Very often, we think we know better than God. We don't even care to pray or seek God's help or direction when we face trouble. We often rely on our own wisdom. There is much to learn from Elijah.

As Elijah approached the gate of the city, he met the widow gathering sticks. God's timing is always perfect. When God calls someone to do His work, He will have a perfect plan for him. He will lead and guide his every step.

What did Elijah ask the widow to do?

Thought: God will guide me all the way if I ask Him to. All I have to do is follow.

Prayer: Heavenly Father, help me to seek Thy will for my life always and help me to obey Thee faithfully. Guide me each step of the way. In Jesus' name I pray. Amen.

LED BY THE SPIRIT OF GOD

God has a plan for every one of us. His spirit will guide us step by step to fulfil it. We need to do our part by listening and obeying. For Elijah, God planned his meeting with the widow who will minister to him. When Elijah arrived at Zarephath. God made sure that the widow was at the gate to meet him at the right time. The moment when he saw her at the gate of the city, gathering sticks, he knew whom she was.

When Elijah requested for water to drink, she promptly went to fetch some. It is amazing that she did it. Why? Because water was really scarce in a drought. Moreover, he was a stranger in that land. The widow did not hesitate because God had prepared her heart to do it.

Then Elijah asked for a morsel of bread. In response, she disclosed that she only had a handful of wheat flour and a bit of oil to make the last meal for her and her son. She was mentally prepared for both she and her son to die after that for they would have run out of food! Look at Elijah's reply, "Fear not; go and do as thou hast said: but make me thereof a little cake first, and bring it unto me, and after make for thee and thy son." (1 Kings 17:13). If these words were not from God, do you think Elijah would have spoken them?

THE WIDOW WAS A WOMAN OF FAITH

The widow at Zarephath was very poor. She had nothing left to live on, but a handful of flour and a little oil for a last meal with her son. She had only sticks to make a fire with. Was she not in greater need of help than Elijah?

Yet, God sent Elijah to this poor widow to be taken care of. This is beyond human understanding. However, Elijah just trusted God and went as told. When the widow revealed that her food supply was almost fully used up, Elijah assured her that: “For thus saith the God of Israel, The barrel of meal shall not waste, neither shall the cruse of oil fail, until the day that the Lord sendeth rain upon the earth.” (1 Kings 17:14). Without a question or doubt, the widow just got up and made the cake Elijah asked for, before cooking for her son and herself. She acted in faith. She believed Elijah’s words were truly the words of God.

The widow lived by faith. God was so pleased by her faith that He blessed her with a never-ending supply of flour and oil. You can also live like this widow, trusting God to help you deal with bullies at school, give tithes no matter how little pocket money you have and overcome that addiction of computer games.

GOD THE CREATOR SUPPLIES FOR HIS PEOPLE

You'd know the story of "Aladdin and his magic lamp". It is just that – a story, a fairy tale. What about the story of barrel of meal and the cruse of oil that did not run out until the rain came? It is a true account in history. It is recorded in the Bible which is God's word. There are many of such accounts in the Bible about God's special provision of daily needs for His people.

When God's people were wandering for forty years in the wilderness, God supplied them with fresh manna daily and water. Even their clothing and footwear did not wear out. This is impossible today, and it is impossible for any human to re-produce, but with God, nothing is impossible. Another such miracle is recorded in the New Testament (Matthew 14:14-21). Jesus fed five thousand of His followers with just five loaves and two fishes given by a boy. This means that every time the disciples reached into the basket holding his loaves of bread, the loaves kept multiplying.

God never changes. Just as He supplies for His people in the past, He will do the same today.

A TEST OF ELIJAH'S FAITH

Disaster suddenly struck in the widow's home. Her son fell sick and died. The widow was so grieved that she forgot how God had blessed them with food that had sustained them so far. She began to blame Elijah for her son's death. Her husband died, she was plagued with poverty, and now her only real love and possession in the world – her son – has died!

The widow at Zarephath thought her son's death was a punishment from God because Elijah's presence had reminded God of her sins. Being a Gentile (a non-Jew), this woman of faith did not know God's Word well. God disciplines His children but punishes only those who ignore His warnings and willfully or purposely continue to sin by worshipping idols. She did not know that God was not punishing her, and has a very good purpose for her son's death.

Elijah was thus far respected by the widow. Now he suffered blame from her. It was a test of his faith. Elijah did not let his feelings distract him. He continued to exercise his faith. He prayed earnestly and a miracle happened.

Prayer: Heavenly Father, may I seek Thee in prayer whenever I face a problem. In Jesus' name I pray. Amen.

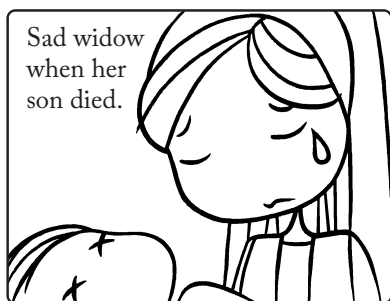
ELIJAH PASSED THE TEST OF FAITH

God gave Elijah the power to raise a dead child to life. When the widow blamed him for her son's death, he must have felt miserable. But Elijah knew God's Word well and was confident that God had a purpose for the tragedy.

The first thing that Elijah did was to turn to God in prayer. He carried the child to his bed in the guest chamber. There, he cried to the Lord, "O Lord my God, hast thou also brought evil upon the widow with whom I sojourn, by slaying her son?" (1 Kings 17:20). He then stretched himself three times upon the boy and cried out to the Lord God to revive him. God then answered Elijah's prayer. The child was brought back to life! Can you imagine his mother's joy? It must have been such an amazing experience for them! She must have also learnt that when God forgives her sins, He will remember them no more.

The disaster turned into victory as Elijah turned to God in prayer. In times of trouble, we must follow Elijah's example. Faithfully pray for God's guidance.

ELIJAH LIVED ACCORDNG TO GOD'S WORD

Many days after Elijah had raised the widow's son from the dead, God's word came to Elijah. "Go, shew thyself unto Ahab." The Bible says, "And Elijah went to show himself to Ahab." Elijah obeyed God's word without hesitation. He lived by God's word as it meant everything to him. Elijah was such a godly man. No wonder God could use him to be a mighty prophet.

God commanded Elijah to go into hiding, first at the brook of Cherith and then at Zarephath. Now, God sent him to go and face King Ahab at Samaria and to tell him that He would be sending rain. After more than three years of drought and famine, King Ahab's fury against Elijah must have reached its peak. His order to capture Elijah was sent to every nation and kingdom. Would it not be sure death for Elijah if he were to show up before the king?

It is a marvel that Elijah did not worry a bit about his own life. All he cared about was to obey God's word. He trusted God with his whole heart. Do you know this is the way a Christian should live?

When Jesus was tempted by the devil to turn stones in the wilderness into bread, He quoted a verse from the book of Deuteronomy. Read Matthew 4:4 to write down what he said.

A MAN NAMED OBADIAH FEARS GOD



Obadiah was the governor of King Ahab's house. He is an interesting character. When the Bible first speaks of him, he was described as a God-fearing man who did a kind act to God's prophets while in King Ahab's service.

We know that he was serving the wicked King Ahab because he was ordered to go with Ahab to find grass to feed Ahab's horses and mules. The long drought had taken a toll on Ahab's horses and mules. The king had to go

personally to faraway places in the land to look for grass.

Obadiah feared God from his youth. That gave him courage to hide a hundred of God's prophets in caves where he supplied them with food and water. They were persecuted by Jezebel, Ahab's idolatrous and wicked queen. Obadiah took a stand for his faith although he did it in secret. God had caused the king and queen to be blind to his act. OBADIAH'S FEAR OF HIS EARTHLY MASTER

Obadiah was out searching for green grass with his master King Ahab. They separated to try to cover more ground. Elijah was led by the Spirit to where Obadiah was. Obadiah instantly knew he was Elijah though they had never met. How did they know? Was there email or Facebook then where they could have “linked up” before they met? No way! It was truly amazing how the Spirit of God works. Obadiah greeted Elijah with great respect saying, “Art thou that my lord Elijah?”

Elijah confirmed his own identity. He asked Obadiah to tell Ahab of his intention to speak to Ahab. Obadiah begged to be excused from the task. He feared that God might send Elijah elsewhere to protect him from Ahab after Obadiah had told Ahab of his whereabouts. Then, King Ahab might accuse him of lying and put him to death. For the last three years, King Ahab was so anxious to capture Elijah that he had issued his order far and wide. Obadiah's fear of his master was not without reason.

2. God’s Word is in their hearts and they obey God’s every command.

GOD HAS CONTROL OVER ALL THINGS

God sent Obadiah to tell King Ahab to meet Elijah. King Ahab did not hesitate. As soon as he arrived, he spoke disrespectfully to God's messenger, "Art thou he that troubleth Israel?" Compare that to Obadiah's salutation.

Elijah immediately corrected King Ahab of his wrong accusation. He told King Ahab that it was the sins of Ahab and his forefathers that have brought the drought upon Israel. They had turned from worshipping God to worshipping "Baalim" - idols and false gods. God's anger was on Ahab and his idolatrous forefathers. Under normal circumstances, Elijah could have been killed by the king by now. But he was able to continue speaking to King Ahab. He requested Ahab to gather all four hundred and fifty prophets of Baal and Jezebel's four hundred prophets of the groves, scattered throughout Israel, to meet him at Mt. Carmel.

Amazingly, King Ahab obeyed the order and later on at Mt Carmel, was a great showdown between these ungodly prophets and Elijah. This could not have happened if God were not in control. God is always in control.

What forces do you think keep our earth spinning and rotating round the sun? What powers keep the sun in its place, and not move towards earth? If it did, life on earth would burn up for the sun's heat would be unbearable if it were nearer. How do we explain such things? Are they because of "luck"? No! The whole world is controlled and supported by God!

Thought: God is in control of all things.

Prayer: Heavenly Father, thank You for choosing me to be your child. I know You are in control of all things. In Jesus' name I pray. Amen.

THERE IS ONLY ONE LIVING AND TRUE GOD

When the people of Israel, and all the prophets of Baal and Jezebel had arrived at Mt. Carmel, Elijah rebuked the people of their double-mindedness. He pointed out that they would sometimes worship the God of Israel and sometimes Baal and other gods. He described them as “halting between two opinions” (vs 21).

Elijah stood alone on the Lord’s side. He worshipped only the one true God of Israel. He challenged the people to make a decision to serve whoever they considered to be God – either the God of Israel or Baal. There was no answer. Then Elijah proposed a contest between himself and all the prophets of Baal and the other gods, to help them see who is God. Both sides would prepare a sacrifice each and the God or god who answers by sending down fire to consume the sacrifice would be God. All approved of his proposal.

What about you? Have you decided to be on the Lord’s side? Remember Jesus’ words. He says that no man can serve two masters. You cannot serve God and money, or anything money can bring.

NO ANSWER FROM BAAL

The people of Israel agreed that the contest would be a fair method to tell who is truly more powerful – the God of Elijah or Baal. The true God will have the power to send down fire on the sacrifice.

Each party had to prepare a bullock and lay it onto the wood with no fire beneath. Baal's prophets were told to begin first. Elijah was confident that the Lord's answer would be instant. He knew no matter how much time the four hundred and fifty prophets take, they would not get an answer. From morning till noon, they called out to Baal. Then, they began to leap and dance around the altar. What a ruckus! Past noon, Elijah mocked them; suggesting that they cry louder because their god could be meditating, gone on a journey or fallen asleep! Closer to evening, they were desperate and began cutting themselves with knives and swords till blood gushed out. They did this to show to their "god" they were sincere and need his help. Still, there was not even a whimper from Baal.

That was not surprising at all. We know that idols have no power of their own and cannot even talk or walk. But today, idolaters still carry out the senseless acts like the prophets of Baal who never got an answer.

ELIJAH RAN FOR HIS LIFE

The victory at Mt. Carmel was spectacular. Elijah ordered the people to capture and kill all the prophets of Baal. Then, he went up to Mt. Carmel to pray for rain and rain came down in abundance just as he had prophesied to King Ahab. The people seemed to have turned from worshipping idols to worshipping the God of Israel. Everything seemed to be going well.

Then the shocking news came - Jezebel wanted his life. Apparently, King Ahab had reported to his wife all of Elijah's deeds, including the slaying of her prophets. The Bible says that Elijah got up and ran for his life. Surprised? The courageous prophet, who had stood against hundreds of God's enemies and the nation of Israel, now panicked and decided to run for his life. After all the experience of the Lord's protection and provisions, what had happened to his courage?

Actually, we should not be surprised. Remember Elijah is human like us. He had weaknesses too. He had expected the people who witnessed the miracle at Mt Carmel to have repented and been converted, but none stood on his side when Jezebel threatened him. When he realised that they had not repented, he felt disappointed. His work as a prophet seemed to have come to nought. Don't we sometimes feel like running away from our troubles?

GOD SHOWED ELIJAH MERCY

You must know what a marathon is. It is a very tough and long race of about 42 km or 26 miles. Wow – 26 miles – that is very long. But you know what? Elijah ran a distance almost 4 times that because he ran a hundred-mile-long marathon, from Jezreel in the north all the way to Beersheba in the south. He was desperate to get away from Jezebel. Leaving his servant in Beersheba, he traveled for another day into the wilderness. Then, he came to rest under a juniper tree. There, he requested the Lord to take his life. He felt that his ministry as a prophet had failed and he could be of no more use to God. Then he fell asleep.

Don't we sometimes think we fail, like Elijah did? Don't we sometimes tell God what to do instead of asking Him to tell us what we should do? So, what was God's answer to Elijah's request? He sent an angel to wake Elijah up to eat the cake and to drink the water brought to him. He did and fell asleep again. It was obvious that God's answer was no. The angel of the Lord was sent a second time and said to him, "Arise and eat: because the journey is too great for thee." God sustained him with food that would give him sufficient strength for his journey to Mt. Horeb that would last for forty days and forty nights. God knew where he intended to go.

Previously, Elijah would go wherever God commanded him to. Now, he went to the wilderness on his own accord. It was not ordered by God. Yet God showed him mercy.

ELIJAH QUILTS THE MINISTRY

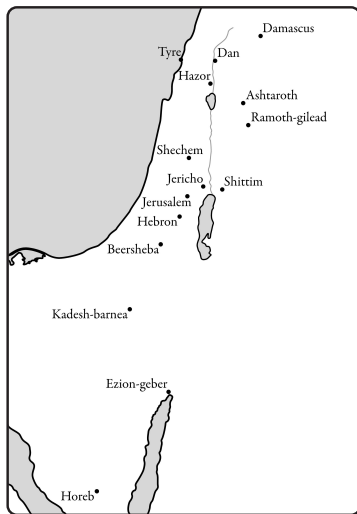
God showed Elijah that He is all-powerful and in absolute control of all things. He demonstrated to Elijah that he could create strong winds, earthquakes and fire, but He was not in them. God showed Elijah that these miracles will not bring about repentance in people. On the other hand, when He spoke in a still small voice, hearts of people can be changed. In other words, only the Holy Spirit through the Word of God is able to bring about repentance and the conversion of hearts.

Elijah was discouraged. He thought that he was alone fighting zealously on God's side. But the Lord later told him that he was not alone; there were seven thousand other who had not bowed their knees to Baal. The Lord asked Elijah "what doest Thou here, Elijah" a second time (verse 13). He had previously asked Elijah the same question (1 Kings 19:9). The Lord was giving Elijah a chance to admit is wrong and continue in his ministry. But instead Elijah asked God to take his life. This meant that Elijah wanted to give up his ministry.

The Lord accepted Elijah's request to quit the ministry. Elijah was then sent by God to anoint Elisha as prophet in his place. God had chosen Elisha to be Elijah's successor.

Elijah should have continued in his ministry and trusted the Lord to help him. Although Elijah was overall a faithful prophet, this was one of his short comings. When we face difficulties in serving God, we must not give up. We need to persevere, pray and depend on the Lord.

How do we know that? It is by listening to the still small voice and by studying God's Word. This remnant of believers of God kept God's law in their hearts and obeyed God's Word. They stood firm on the Lord's side. Just like we need food daily, we need to read the Bible every day if we want to grow spiritually. God's Word is food for our souls.

GOD IS FORGIVING AND JUST

Ahaziah became king after Ahab's death. He was as idolatrous as his father. While Moab rebelled against Israel, Ahaziah fell through a lattice or a skylight, in his palace. When he became very sick, he sent his messengers to ask Baal-zebub, the god of Ekron whether he would recover. His action angered the Lord, who sent Elijah to tell his messengers that he would surely die because he had turned to other gods instead of the God of Israel.

Following Elijah's message, he sent a captain with 50 men to capture Elijah. He must have thought that capturing Elijah could change his message. When the captain found Elijah on top of a hill, he ordered him to see the king. Elijah replied that fire would surely descend from heaven to consume him and his men. Instantly, fire came down. Ahaziah sent another captain and fifty men and they were also killed by fire from heaven. Stubborn Ahaziah sent a third captain and his fifty men. The third captain was different. He was repentant, begging Elijah to spare their lives. God forgave him and told Elijah to go with him. Elijah obeyed and told Ahaziah personally that he would surely die. God will never change his mind about judgement. He knows all things from beginning to end.

God loves us and is ever ready to forgive us our sins. However, He is just and will judge sinners. God knows all things from the beginning to end.

The Bible did not tell us much about Elijah's background except that he was a Tishbite. He came from an unknown mountain in Gilead. Only now were we told a little of his appearance. "He was a hairy man, girt with a girdle of leather about his loins."

Elijah could have come from an unknown or lowly background but look at all the powerful deeds God led him to do! He stood before King Ahab and pronounced God's punishment of a drought because of idolatry. He stood against hundreds of Baal's and Jezebel's prophets at Mt. Carmel, calling down fire to consume his evening sacrifice to the Lord. God sent him to anoint kings and even to bring a message of death to King Ahaziah. Elijah twice called down fire from heaven to consume captains and their fifty men. No wonder he is sometimes called "The Prophet of Fire"!

Do you sometimes feel that you are too small to do anything great for God? Think of Elijah. Also remember how faithful and obedient to God he was and how fervently he prayed.

Thought: God can use even me when I trust and obey Him.

TAKEN TO HEAVEN IN A WHIRLWIND

God gives a prophet power to rebuke men and to foretell future events. Therefore, it is not surprising that Elijah knew when God was taking him to heaven. Even Elisha, his successor and God's prophets at Bethel and Jericho knew.

Elisha stuck close to him while he travelled from Gilgal to Bethel, then to Jericho and finally to the river Jordan. Fifty prophets came to the river Jordan and stood at a distance. God had gathered them to witness the departure of their leader and they expected no less than a spectacular event. As Elijah smote the waters with his cloak, the waters parted creating dry land for both Elijah and Elisha to walk on. As they talked, a chariot of fire and horses of fire appeared from above separating Elijah and Elisha. Thus, Elijah went up to heaven by a whirlwind. What a sight it must have been!

Elijah was taken up to heaven without dying. Would you like to be taken to heaven without dying? One day the Lord Jesus Christ will return, and we will be with Him forever in heaven.

This month we shall look at different types of wrong behaviour. As the Bible is our authoritative book for faith and practice, we shall address why the behaviour is wrong.

Let's start with a story on playing pranks. James is the joker of his class. When his classmates laugh at his jokes and pranks, he loves the attention he gets. They all really like him. Quite the opposite of James is Linda, a quiet girl in his class. No one really talks much to her, because she is quiet and she also stutters.

One day, James decides to do something which he thinks is funny and will trick his classmates. On arriving at school, he puts on a glum face which of course puzzles his friends. They start to approach him to find out what is wrong with him.

"I... chok..ed...ed..ooooon....t..t..he... ap...ap...ple...", James starts to speak, and with great difficulty. His pretentious act works, for it draws more and more of his friends, even quiet Linda, to crowd around him. His classmates are all in shock. James tries so hard to explain why he is speaking in a stammering manner. Suddenly, laughing out loudly, James explodes, "Gotcha, I don't stutter!" This really hurts Linda who walks away quickly. All can see her crying in the corner.

It is perfectly alright to crack jokes and play pranks on friends but sometimes we may get carried away like James. Today's reading describes the love Christians should have for other Christians. Love is showing kindness and affection. We have the example of Jesus Christ to follow. As Christians, we must love others, not only fellow Christians, but even more so, the non-Christians.

Thought: Have you purposed in your heart to be kind and loving towards others, Christians and non-Christians alike?

Prayer: Heavenly Father, remind me that I must not have fun at the expense of others. I have been unkind towards my friends before, please forgive me. In Jesus' name, I pray - Amen.

DO YOU SHARE THINGS WILLINGLY?

Siew Hoon's elder sister, Siew Leng, is the apple of her mother's eye. She loves shopping and many of her purchases are not necessary but mother does not stop her. In this aspect, mother treats Siew Hoon differently and monitors her shopping. Mother shows favouritism to Siew Leng.

One day, Siew Leng buys a special bottle of shampoo imported from the US, and leaves it in the bathroom. That evening, when Siew Hoon is in the bathroom and is about to wash her hair, she realises her own shampoo is used up and so she calls out to her older sister to use her shampoo but she is not at home. So Siew Hoon uses the new shampoo. After her bath, knowing that her sister can be unreasonable, she intends to wait for her sister to return to tell her she has used the shampoo. But she falls asleep.

When Siew Leng returns home and finds out that the cap of the bottle of new shampoo has been tampered with, she immediately knows who the culprit is. She flies into a rage! "How dare you use my shampoo! And don't you know it is my NEW shampoo – a special brand from the US! You are so rude, you should have asked permission!" Siew Hoon tries to explain but her sister will not listen. Siew Leng complains to mother who scolds Siew Hoon as well!

Dear child, are you like Siew Leng, who does not share? It is wrong not to share things with others. 'He that hath a bountiful eye' in today's reading refers to one who seeks out charity and gives to or shares with one in need. The opposite of 'bountiful eye' is a wicked eye. Are you a child that has a 'bountiful eye' or a wicked eye?

Thought: It is more blessed to give than to receive (Acts 20:35)

Prayer: Heavenly Father, sharing my things with others will make them happy and You will be pleased with me. Help me remember today's lesson. This I pray in Jesus' name - Amen.

HOW MANY FRIENDS DO YOU HAVE?

Some of you have Facebook accounts as do your friends, siblings, and parents. The writer also has a Facebook account and as he was browsing it the other day, he was surprised that he has more than 200 “friends”. Wow – that is a lot! Are all these really his friends?

What is a friend? One dictionary defines a friend as ‘a person who shares the same feelings of natural liking and understanding, the same interests, etc and is not a member of the same family’. In simple words, people who like and understand each other and also like to do things together are friends. You like John and John likes you. You trust Jane and Jane trusts you. You and Michael always play together. Then the writer asks himself – do I feel this way for these 200 “friends”? The frank answer is “No”. Here is the wrong idea of a friend. Some of you may have the idea that the more friends we have, the more popular we are. That is simply not true. However, this may be what you hear in school. Your classmates may even tell you that to have more friends you have to do what they want you to do. While this may be alright in certain circumstances, it can be dangerous for a Christian child to be involved in activities such as hanging out with gangs, playing truant, bullying others and the list goes on.

It is important how we choose our friends. Friends are people we can trust and confide in, and there is no way we can confide and share our problems with 200 people! So you have to choose friends carefully. Some people are smart or good-looking or come from wealthy homes. Do you choose these types of people to be your friends? In the selection of a king to rule Israel, the Lord advised Samuel not to look at ‘his countenance, or on the height of his stature...’ (1 Sam 16:7). In the same way, don’t choose a friend based on outward appearance or status or wealth. Instead, choose a person who has true inner value within. This person should be one whom you can trust and share your problems with, and will stay close and stand by you in times of difficulties. This is the meaning of the phrase ‘a brother is born for adversity’ which we read in the text today.

Thought: ‘Greater love hath no man than this, that a man lay down his life for his friends’ (John 15:13). Jesus calls us his friends’ (John 15:15).

Prayer: Heavenly Father, help me choose my friends wisely. This I pray in Jesus’ name – Amen.

BAD FRIENDSHIPS

John takes out his mini electronic game device during JW class to play. He knows it is wrong but he listens to his friend David who says it is alright to do so. David is regarded as the 'leader' in class. Some female classmates have told John not to follow David blindly. However, John trusts David and so he continues playing. While he is engrossed in playing, the teacher notices his game device and calls out to him.

"John, what are you doing?" asked the teacher. "Mmmm, I am doing some stuff," answered John. Some students laugh but the teacher is not amused and so they keep quiet. John confesses, "I am playing the electronic game, because David said it was OK to do so!"

Immediately, David retorts, "This is not true, John, I never told you it is OK!" It was a blatant lie, but David did not even bat an eyelid saying it. David, though he has been attending church for a long time, was a habitual liar and lying was second nature to him.

John bursts out crying for he feels betrayed by a friend. The Lord Jesus was betrayed by His own disciple Judas Iscariot. Apostle Paul also felt betrayed by many who deserted him. David was a bad influence and bad company for John. Bad behaviour is infectious and can lead us to sin against God. Dear child, remember to keep good company.

Thought: Name some good qualities of a friend.

Prayer: Heavenly Father, help me to be careful not to be influenced by others to sin against you. Help me to keep good company. In Jesus' name I pray – Amen.

BLAME SHIFTING

Bee Leng's mother plans to visit a friend who is sick in the hospital to encourage her. She asks Bee Leng to take care of her toddler sister, Bee Hoon, at home in her absence. Before leaving home, she tells Bee Leng not to allow Bee Hoon to go near the cans of paint in the balcony.

At first, it is easy to watch over Bee Hoon, but when Bee Leng receives a phone call from her good friend Martha, she excitedly chats with Martha on the phone, and forgets all about supervising her toddler sister. She loses track of what Bee Hoon is doing.

Suddenly, Bee Leng hears a crashing sound. She hangs up the phone and goes to find out what has caused the noise. To her horror, her sister has toppled a can of paint. As the cover was not closed properly, the paint spilt all over the floor.

Sternly, Bee Leng stares at her little sister. And guess what happens next? The sister, knowing she has done wrong, instead turns and looks at their pet dog, and says, "Naughty dog!" The little girl shifts blame on the dog!

Covering of sins is mentioned in today's reading. One who covers sins does not let others know he has sinned or puts the blame on someone else. It is wrong to cover sins. Don't be like Bee Hoon.

Thought: Read 1 John 1:9 on forgiveness of sins.

BRAGGING

John is a smart boy. Not only is he eloquent but he also has a good memory. Every year he excels in school and emerges among the top in his class. However, John has a weakness: bragging. What is bragging? Bragging is talking too proudly about oneself, one's possessions, etc. Another word for bragging is boasting. You can imagine John is not a popular boy in school for he goes around telling people how clever he is, what good memory he has... Because John is a braggart, no one in his class wants to be his friend.

As the mid-year examinations draws near, teachers encourage the pupils to work hard. True to his conceited self, John proclaims he will do well again. When the exam timetable is given out, John takes a copy home and chucks it aside without looking at it.

Days and weeks go by, John still feels very confident. Although he occasionally revises his studies, he is easily distracted, does not focus and so does not know his work well. When the exams are a week away, his parents ask how he is coping with the revision and he tells his parents that he is doing just fine! However, when he realises he has lost his timetable, he starts to panic and is no longer as cool as a cucumber. Now he starts to worry that he may fail his exams. He confesses his sin to God for being a braggart. And you know what? Shortly after, John finds his lost timetable!

Actually, children like to boast and you see them doing this all the time and everywhere. Dear child, are you a braggart? What do you boast about? Never brag if you are the best student in class, or in school, or even in the whole of Singapore. Never brag about what post your father holds in his company and that he has friends in high places. Never boast that you have the latest television set in your home, or that your mum has bought you the latest video game console like the PSP, Nintendo DS, X-Box, etc.. Talking proudly of yourself or your possessions is displeasing to God who detests one who has a high look and a proud heart.

Thought: Are you guilty of bragging?

Prayer: Heavenly Father, thank You for reminding me that I should not be proud and brag. I have bragged before, please forgive me. This I pray in Jesus' name – Amen.

CONCEIT

Yesterday we talked about bragging, today, we shall talk about something more subtle – conceit. While a braggart talks proudly about himself or something he owes, a conceited person harbours pride in his heart and thinks highly of himself. A braggart is easily identified when he shows pride but a conceited person may not display it.

Tim comes from a wealthy family. His father is a successful businessman, and the family lives in a large bungalow in an exclusive part of Singapore. His bedroom is larger than a small HDB flat. Born with a silver spoon in his mouth, he is used to luxurious living and travelling to faraway expensive places for vacation. As the only child, he is spoilt. He is driven to school in a chauffeur-driven car. At primary 3, he is given \$10 a day for pocket money. He harbours conceit in his heart because his family is rich. Though he has been taught in church to be humble, he never gives much thought to it until one day, his conceitedness reveals itself.

His class is discussing holiday destinations. Each student is asked to share where he has been for holiday. Kok Leong, who comes from a poor family, is very excited and shouts out his that family has gone to Malacca. It was his first overseas trip and although Malacca is nearby, it was a big deal to Kok Leong. When it comes to Tim's turn, he cannot hide his pride and exclaims he will not be excited if he has gone to Malacca. If it is America, Tim boasts, then he will be overjoyed and he also adds, "Malacca sounds like America, but they are very different, you know?"

Romans 12 from which today's text is taken speaks of the unity of the Body of Christ. (Read the whole chapter) Conceitedness in Christians will destroy harmony and so causes division and disunity and lack of love for each other. Tim's conceited nature creates a distance between himself and others, and he will not enjoy true fellowship with fellow believers.

Thought: Pride goeth before destruction, and an haughty spirit before a fall (Proverbs 16:18).

Prayer: Heavenly Father, please help me not to be proud, but be humble. The Bible says it is wrong to be proud, and please help me not to fall into sin. This I pray in Jesus' name – Amen.

COMPLAINING (1)

Jane and Jean are identical twins who are similar in many ways. This makes it hard to tell them apart based on their looks, dressing, likes, dislikes and even their tendency to complain. Whenever they are asked to do a chore by mum or dad, they will complain and murmur.

Such a nature stems from selfishness and self-centeredness. When doing a chore, they will not co-operate. They operate on a 'I-do-mine-and-you-do-yours' attitude. For example, Jane will wash her own plate after use and not Jean's and vice-versa. Complaining to their parents about each other is very much a common practice at home and it is not a pretty sight at all. Their attitude leads to a 'no-one-does-anything' attitude and so one day, something terrible almost happens.

The twins live with their 80 year old grandma, and they have been told not to leave their things on the floor in case grandma trips on those things. This instruction fell on deaf ears. One night, after returning from a party, instead of putting away their bags properly, they left their bags on the floor haphazardly. Even though they were aware of their parents' instruction, they could not be bothered to obey because they were self-centred.

The next morning, after grandma woke up, she tripped over the bags because the colour of the bags blended in with the colour of the floor. Thankfully, her fall was cushioned by the nearby sofa and she was not badly hurt. However, she suffered a nasty shock. When the twins learnt of it, they apologised to grandma. They were ashamed and promised not to be selfish or complain or argue with each other.

Thought: Do you complain or murmur? Do you argue with your sibling over who is to do the chores at home?

Prayer: Heavenly Father, teach me not to complain, especially when I am asked to do some chores. I must always be willing to help others at home, in school and church. This I pray in Jesus' name – Amen.

COMPLAINING (2)

Dad has a respectable job as an engineer in a big company. Mum is a housewife. They live in a large nicely-furnished 5-room HDB flat with their 2 sons, Peow and Peng. The children are well provided for and do not lack anything.

Peow and Peng attend a school where a lot of the kids come from wealthy families. Most of these kids go to school in their parents' cars or are chauffeured in big cars. This is a sore point for the brothers. Why? They envy these children who have nice cars. Their father has no car and they have to take the school bus which is not so comfortable compared to a chauffeur-driven car. Besides, taking the bus means waking up early as the bus driver needs to go to different places to pick up students.

Day by day, their envy of others intensifies and advances to the development of a complaining spirit and discontentment. One day, Peow complains to his mum, "Mum, why don't we have a car? A lot of my friends' parents have cars. Some even have more than one car!" His younger brother also adds, "Mum, it is embarrassing to go to school in a bus!"

Dear child, do you sometimes feel this way like Peow or Peng? You envy your friends living in big houses and having nice cars. You start to murmur why you don't have what your friends have. Does having material things equate to godliness? Some people think so but we learn from today's scriptural reading that when we are contented and do not envy or covet, we are counted godly and so in the same manner, when we are godly, we will be contented and will not complain.

Thought: Have you complained about what you don't have?

Prayer: Heavenly Father, I confess that I sometimes complain about not having things that I wish I had. Remind me that covetousness and complaining is a sin and help me not to do it again. This I pray in the name of Jesus – Amen.

CONFLICT RESOLUTION: THE OFFENDED

Gabriel and John are brothers. Being the older brother, Gabriel leads by example and will give in to John. However, John is not easy to get along with. Not only is John selfish, he likes to make up stories about others.

One evening while mum is in the kitchen preparing dinner, 11-year old John shouts loudly from the bedroom in a distinctive “informer” sing-song voice saying, “Mommmeeee, Gabriel said ‘SHUT UP’ to meeeee...!” In a calm manner, Gabriel strides into the kitchen where their mother is and says, “Mum, it was John who started it. He first took my things without permission, broke my electronic calculator without informing me, and then looked at my SMSes. And when I tried to reason with him, he said that since I am named after an archangel of the New Testament, I should forgive him. I did not say ‘shut up’, I told him to stop the nonsense.”

Mum gently says, “Gabriel. I am pleased with you, showing understanding towards your brother despite his actions. You are really an angel! I know John likes to make up stories and has done those things. Will you forgive him?” Gabriel replies with a smile, “I forgive John.” In fact, he has been praying that God will help him to have patience and long suffering when conflicts with John arise.

John overhears Gabriel’s conversation with mum when he is about to enter the kitchen. His heart is pricked and is ashamed of himself and confesses his sin.

Today’s reading describes how to behave towards enemies. 1 Peter was written by the apostle Peter. At that time Christians were hated and badly treated by all men for Christ’s sake, many were even martyred, so Peter warned them not to return evil for evil. Taking revenge is an unchristian practice. Dear child, the guiding principle is that when you are offended by anyone, you do not bear any grudge and take revenge. Be like Gabriel. Be an angel. You will ‘inherit a blessing’ as promised by God.

Thought: Do not repay evil with evil

Prayer: Heavenly Father, help me to remember that when there is conflict, I should not blow my top, and instead should look to You for help and guidance to react kindly to people though they are wrong. This I pray in Jesus’ name - Amen.

CONFLICT RESOLUTION: THE OFFENDER

Paul gets along well with the kids in his neighbourhood. A smart and fun kid to be with, he is also assertive and has leadership qualities which others admire. Despite his strengths, Paul has one big flaw: bad temper.

Paul and his friends love to play basketball in the open court near their flats and will spend hours on end having fun in the court. Sometimes, they challenge other groups of boys to games of basketball and feel jubilant when they win. Many groups are no match for Paul's team except for one from a nearby secondary school. The challenge has come from these secondary school guys. Paul, assuming leadership, told his team mates to train hard to win.

For hours each day, they sweat and toil. They are happy to do so as they want badly to win their strongest competitor. When the important day finally comes, they are excited and put up a fight. However, the other team is faster and has more stamina. Furthermore, they are more accurate in their throws and it is obviously clear that Paul and his friends are no match this time.

Paul's team has lost. The boys are all moody. Paul puts the blame on Kok Leong for not guarding the "star" player of the winning team. His accusation causes Kok Leong to be unhappy and for the first time, he opposes Paul publicly. Now Paul is furious! He scolds Kok Leong for arguing with him and challenging his judgment and authority as the team leader. He loses his cool, goes up to Kok Leong, grabs him by the shirt and shakes him very hard. Paul's behaviour and actions shocks everyone.

Oh yes, bad temper. Many of us are like Paul. When things go wrong, we throw our temper and flare up, offending and hurting others. Don't agitate others or you will run into trouble.

Thought: Read Proverbs 21:23. This is a verse that can keep us out of trouble.

Prayer: Heavenly Father, I have lost my temper many times before. Please forgive me. Help me remember today's lesson and apply it. This I pray in Jesus' name – Amen.

COVETING

“Hey Tom, my parents bought me a new pencil case over the weekend. Want to see?” said Peter, Tom’s best friend in school.

Tom laughed. “What’s so special about a pencil case?”

“It’s not just a pencil case. It has tons of special features. I’ll show you.” The plastic box had many compartments and a long row of buttons on the side. As Peter pressed each button, fascinating things happened — lights shone, flaps popped up, and pens appeared where you would least expect them. There was even a complicated sequence that Peter could press to open a top secret compartment.

By the end of the demonstration, Tom’s mouth was hanging open. “Can I use it for a while?” he begged.

“Sure, just return it to me before the class starts later,” said Peter, generously. Tom placed Peter’s pencil case next to his own pencil case on the table. His pencil case now looked old and boring in comparison, even though he had been perfectly contented with it before.

After school, Tom was still thinking about the pencil case and its amazing features. He rushed through dinner, brushing off his parents’ questions, so that he could search for more information about it online. That night, he even dreamt about how he would get one.

The next day, Tom couldn’t wait to use the pencil case again. But before he could ask Peter, Peter was called away by the teacher to help with something. Tom fidgeted, staring at the pencil case on Peter’s table. He could just take it for a moment, and no one would know. Taking a deep breath, he grabbed the pencil case. But as he did so, he accidentally pressed a button. A cheerful song started to play at maximum volume from the pencil case. Everyone turned to look at Tom. He quickly put the pencil case back, feeling very ashamed.

What is coveting, and why is it wrong? Coveting is craving for something that is not yours, such as others’ clothes, gadgets and grades. To covet is forbidden by God in the 10th Commandment. Coveting may lead us to commit other sins such as stealing.

Thought: Contentment is protection against coveting.

Prayer: Heavenly Father, forgive my sin of covetousness. Please help me not to commit this sin again. This I pray in Jesus’ name – Amen.

DEFIANCE AGAINST PARENTS

10-year-old Shirley is sitting on the couch watching her favorite cartoon Lilo and Stitch. Mum is leaving the house to go to the market. Before leaving, she instructs Shirley to spend not more than another half an hour watching TV and then to do her homework and practise the piano in preparation for her Grade 4 piano exams. As she is engrossed with the TV and is eager to have mum out of the house so she will not be disturbed, she replies, "Yes, yes, Mum." But she has not paid much attention to what mum has said. After mum has left, the TV is everything to her. She uses the remote control to switch from channel to channel, watching one program after another.

After an hour and a half, there is the sound of the door opening and mum has returned home lugging bags of groceries. She is fuming mad when she sees Shirley still watching the TV. Putting the bags in the kitchen and then storming to the TV set, she switches off the machine. Shirley is stunned as well as unhappy, shouting, "Mum, what are you doing? That is the best part of the show." With that, she uses the remote control to turn the TV back on. This time, Mum plucks out the plug from the socket and the TV turns dead. Now the look on Shirley's face turns defiant, and without a word, she strides into her room.

Dear child, are you ever defiant towards your parents? Don't and never! The opposite of defying is obeying. Obeying our parents is the law of the 5th Commandment. The great duty of children is to obey their parents and it involves an inward reverence as well as the outward expression and acts. It is the order of nature as determined by God that parents command and children obey. Though this may be a hard saying, yet it is a duty and those children who want to please the Lord will do it.

Thought: Have you been defying your parents' orders? Think of those things you have done that are defiant and stop them NOW!

Prayer: Thank you Heavenly Father for today's reminder that I must never disobey mum or dad. I must never be defiant by talking back or staring at them. Forgive me and change me to love and obey my parents. This I pray in Jesus' name – Amen.

OTHERS' INTERESTS

Jenny and Jane's grandma visits them every Saturday and buys cute presents and their favourite food for them. They will have a nice time together and in the evening, uncle comes and brings grandma home. Grandma lives with uncle. She looks forward to Saturdays to visit her granddaughters.

On Chinese New Year Day, grandma goes out with the entire family for a meal but something unfortunate happens. She falls when walking up the steps to the restaurant and becomes very weak after that. As she is unable to take care of herself, she needs round-the-clock attention and aid. The family decides that she will live with the family of Jenny and Jane.

Before this incident, the two girls adored their grandma, but now their feelings for her have changed. They do not love her as much as before. Do you know why? Now grandma occupies one of the girls' rooms and so the two sisters have to share a room. The sisters feel a bit cramped for space and they do not like the new arrangement. They complain to their parents.

What is their problem? Today's reading tells us the sisters' problem lie in not thinking first of others. They don't look out for the interests of others, but care only for themselves. Don't be like Jenny or Jane. We should look to Christ as our model. Phil 2:1-11 describes that Christ thinks first of others, not of Himself. He has a servant's attitude, being willing to sacrifice for others. Have you the same attitude?

Actually his parents are not deaf. When they do not quite catch what he says, they simply ignore him and this makes Seng unhappy. Instead of being honest with them about his feelings, what he does is to pretend not to hear his parents because he thinks, "If they can ignore me, so can I."

One day mum comes back from the market feeling hot and tired. Calling out loudly in a clear tone to Seng, she asks him to get her a glass of cold water. Seng is playing computer games in the hall, and has heard his mum. However, he pretends not to hear. Mum calls again and again, but Seng still pretends not to hear. When someone is angry with you, what is the best way to handle it? The Bible has the answer for you which is found in today's text which reads 'a soft answer turneth away wrath'. A soft answer does not mean speaking softly but speaking gently, kindly and respectfully. We speak gently not just to our parents but to anyone we come into contact with. In doing so, we keep peace and can avoid more arguments.

Thought: What do you do when someone is angry with you?

Prayer: Heavenly Father, remind me that by soft words peace may be kept and arguments kept at bay. Help me remember today's lesson. In Jesus' name I pray – Amen.

SELF-CENTEREDNESS

Patricia used to be sickly when young and that made her parents worried. But now, she eats more because she loves food and perhaps because of this, has returned to good health. Patricia loves all types of food, but none more than Japanese food.

Thought: Control your tongue or it will control you!

'Spare the rod and spoil the child' is the teaching of God's Word and so mother will always punish Sean for his bad behaviour. Now, mum is going to punish Sean. But instead, Sally stops her mother and tells her not to punish her little brother. What is Sally up to? In her mind, she thinks that she knows how to teach Sean not to hit people anymore.

She holds Sean's hand firmly and takes him into a bedroom. Thinking that his sister wants to lock him up, he resists and struggles but he is too young to resist. In the bedroom, she manages to pacify Sean and firmly told him, "Let us both kneel down by the bed." The two children kneel down and Sally prays a simple prayer: (Fill in the blanks)

Prayer: Heavenly Father, when someone hurts me, help me remember that fighting back is no use but prayer is the only weapon I have and it is more than enough. In Jesus' name I pray – Amen.

Thought: Memorising bible verses is good, but what is more important than this?

Prayer: Heavenly Father, thank you for today's lesson. Help me to be a hearer and doer of Your Word. In Jesus' name I pray – Amen.

A GENTLE SPIRIT

‘A gentle spirit is a cure-all.’ What does this mean? A man called John told a story about himself. When he was a boy about 10 years old, his father who was a senior officer in the army used to tell him that if someone teased or bullied him, he must fight him to teach him a lesson. Children, do you think in this way, or have you been told this?

John was sent to a famous school and befriended a good student called Tom. Tom was good at playing baseball and so they both got along very well. However, John would skip classes despite Tom telling him not to. One day, another boy came to tell John that Tom had reported his bad conduct to the teachers. John was so furious with Tom and after school he went to Tom’s home.

“Did you tell the teachers about me?” shouted John.

“You may hit me but I want you to know that I won’t fight back,” said Tom firmly. Tom was so firm and yet so mild! Surprisingly, John did not fight but felt ashamed of himself. From that day onwards, he had more respect for Tom. A lot more.

Fighting is not the way to solve problems. Children, very often when you are angry with someone, you may think of doing something to that person. That could include fighting or doing something nasty. You may want to kick, punch or even bite him. Even if you don’t, you will shout or scream. Is this the right behaviour? The right way for a Christian child is to pray, cool down, and then talk it out.

The Bible tells us our Lord Jesus was very gentle with the people when they wrongly accused Him. He neither retaliated nor fought. The prophet Isaiah describes Jesus in this way – ‘He was oppressed, and he was afflicted, yet he opened not his mouth: he is brought as a lamb to the slaughter, and as a sheep before her shearers is dumb, so he openeth not his mouth’ (Isaiah 53:7). So remember, ‘a gentle spirit is a cure-all’!

Thought: Memorise Galatians 5:22, 23.

Prayer: Heavenly Father, forgive me for the times I retaliated against people who made me angry. Help me to be a good Christian. In Jesus’ name I pray – Amen.
